The grant for submission to DVA is to set up the proposed website and ancillary costs including laptop computers, printer etc. was discussed generally. ○ Allen advised that the DVA been contacted, and the submission of the application has to be done by 23/08/2010 at the latest. 	The Banner.	
	Rather than get mired down over ownership/custody, what do you think	

about the following proposal:

The best place for Storage when not in use is undoubtedly as part of the display at the museum, where it is in its own glass fronted display case, above and behind an AN/KPQ1.

- a. It is in a secure environment.
- b. It is on public display as part of a larger 'LOCATING' presentation.
- c. It is not folded, rolled or otherwise stored in a crease/mould producing situation.

It would be available for loan to any person/entity for use under the following conditions:

- a. They are a member/s of LAA/131 or other entity that has a genuine/appropriate requirement for a short term loan (eg. STA Regiment, military oriented function/gathering/reunion/dinner/march etc where it would be appropriate to display the banner).
- b. Full responsibility is accepted for its safe custody.
- c. It is returned in the same condition it was in when collected.
- d. The loan is recorded in a 'short term loan' book.

DVA grant/website

From what I can gather, the main purpose of resurrecting the 131 Association is to be able to apply for a DVA grant for you to set up an independent website. Rather than going through the efforts of raising another association with all the administrative and incorporation (\$\$) issues etc, and to put to bed all the other crap that seems to be breeding, what do you think about the following proposal.

- a. You and your team prepare a submission to DVA for a grant to set up the proposed website.
- b. The submission goes to DVA from the Locating Artillery Association inc.
- c. If approved, the funds are passed onto the Vietnam Veteran's Branch *in full,* and are administered by the VVB, who also administer the website.
- d. The only proviso would be that all E&E personnel involved in the administration of the funds and the website are members of the Locating Artillery Association Inc. (to ensure no comeback from DVA)

The foregoing would be formally minuted as a special executive committee meeting decision, binding on the Locating Artillery Association inc.

Let me know your feelings re all the above.
